Cash Giveaway

The Cash Raffle was another Booster Club fundraiser with 300 tickets sold at \$50 each. From March 1–17, daily winners were drawn for varying cash prizes, with fun drawing videos featuring teachers, staff, and students. The raffle raised a total of **\$8,410** for the Booster Club. (Thank you to Paula Mueeting for organizing!)

Concessions: Powered by Volunteers

Concessions brought in **\$13,228** and ran across 32 school sports events, including football, volleyball, basketball, and track. 300+ shifts were filled by volunteers, with themed menus on special nights like Homecoming. We also paid \$2,400 to TC clubs that worked shifts, creating a win-win opportunity.

Pop-A-Shot & Quarterback Challenge

Back for its second year, Pop-A-Shot remained a fun game-day favorite at basketball games, and this year we added a Quarterback Challenge at football games. These activities brought in about **\$400** while adding excitement for students and fans.

Opened at 13 various events plus a successful Holiday Open House, offering spiritwear and seasonal designs throughout the year. Benefit Dinner Auction

The Trinity Catholic Benefit Dinner Auction raised a net profit of **\$158,141**! With help from very few volunteers and many donors, it remains our biggest fundraiser. Every detail—from solicitation to decorating—was powered by community effort.

1 Trinity Madness: Back to School Bash

We kicked off the year with Trinity Madness, a night of blessings, fellowship, and fun. Families enjoyed a free hot dog dinner, met faculty and staff in their new Booster Club-provided T-shirts, and celebrated the new school year together. It was a joyful evening to reconnect and gear up for what was ahead!

2 Booster Club Purchases

Funds were used to upgrade the concession stands with new iPads and Square stands, improving efficiency. Two new refrigerator/freezers and storage racks were also purchased to better organize the outdoor stand (*thank you to those who assisted with last summer's clean-up night*). We also purchased pipes for the Pipe & Drape system used for the auction and made available for events such as Prom and Kairos at no cost to groups. In addition, we helped fund a new cleaning machine requested by the Maintenance Department.

3 Student Enrichment

We used funds raised to bring speaker Braden Johnson (Create the Culture) to Trinity on September 24. He presented Fulfillment in Christ to both JH and HS students and Love, Relationships, and Chastity to high school students, and also offered an evening parent presentation on Understanding the Hearts of Young People.

4 Teacher Support

We showed our appreciation with:

- A Staff Christmas Fund to simplify gift-giving
 - Daily treats during Teacher Appreciation Week
 - A stocked Teacher Pantry for late nights and conferences
 - Monthly appreciation meals

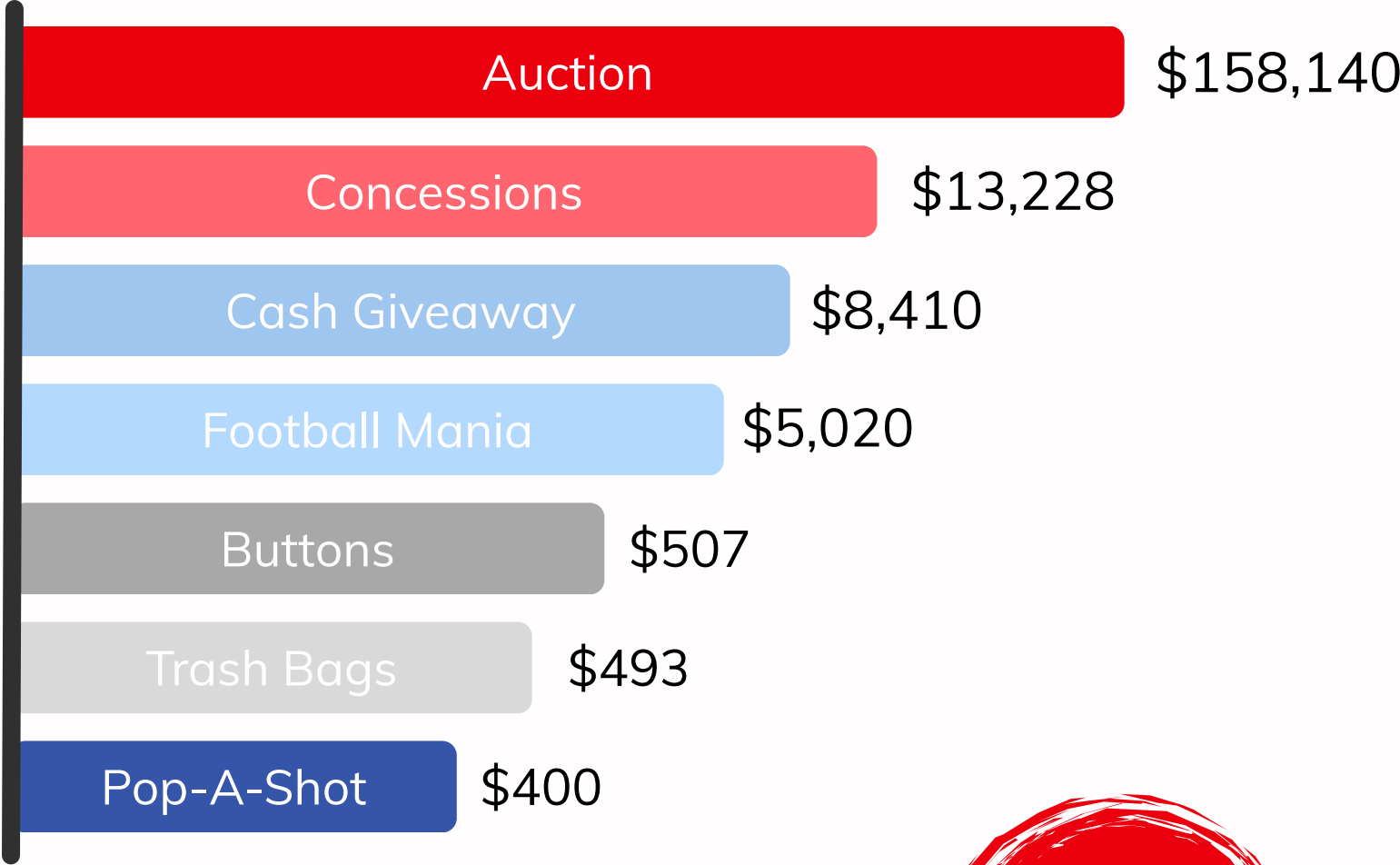
